



Rotating Station Instructions

At 6:30, after the presentation is over, we're planning a series of rotating discussions at the four Land Use Code Update Stations. The four stations are numbered and include:

1. Non-Motorized Transportation
2. Development Frontages (How it looks from the street)
3. Commercial & Multifamily Zones
4. Single Family Zones & Subdivisions

Each discussion will be approximately 15 minutes – which is intended to allow individuals enough time to participate in discussions at each of the four stations. Go to whichever station you like, depending on what interests you most. Here is what will occur at each of the station discussions:

- Each station will be staffed to help facilitate the discussion. They will go through a brief presentation that addresses the survey questions related to the particular station topic and will provide some background information.
- The facilitator will ask for your scores on the applicable questions to get an idea of where the group stands on the concepts and will try to generate discussion as to why participants like or dislike particular concepts. Additional staff may help write notes on the flip chart.
- You are welcome to ask questions and post notes on the displays on elements you like or dislike.
- After each discussion period is up, you are invited to move to one of the other stations of your choice.
- Depending on the number of participants that show up – we might allow additional time at some of the stations, most notably the Non-Motorized Transportation station.

There will also be a similar station for the Energy Efficiency and Conservation Strategy that you can choose to visit either during the rotating sessions or after the meeting.

At 7:45 we will wrap up the discussions, pull the remaining group together and have the facilitators summarize some key findings in the discussions to the whole group.

- Participate, don't dominate
- Listen respectfully
- Suspend judgments and keep an open mind
- Assume no one has THE answer but everyone has a PART of the answer
- Be creative
- Meet your neighbors, talk to strangers and have fun!
