General Qualifications:

- Electricity must be primary source of heat for rebates
 - EXCEPT for upgrading to an Air Source Heat Pump added to a ducted system with Natural Gas Heat
- Weatherization applies to existing electrically heated single family or multifamily site built housing and commercial business buildings
- Portable electric heaters do not qualify as primary electric heating
- Weatherization measures must be installed according to the current BPA Residential Weatherization Specifications linked on the City website as well as federal, state, and local codes
- New Construction, Manufactured Homes or Mobile Homes may not be eligible for all programs
- Commercial lighting rebates are case by case and requires a lighting audit by City staff prior to project starting and proposed lighting equipment upgrades to see if applicant qualifies
- Multi-Family Housing complexes with 5 (five) or more units qualify for exterior lighting upgrades

Rebate Process:

- 1) Complete application for rebate
- 2) Send to Energy Services for review and rebate offer
- 3) Review specifications and terms of rebate including certified heat pump installers and qualified equipment
- 4) Sign Rebate Agreement provided by staff
- 5) Secure building permit and complete work (or hire contractor to complete work) including building permit final inspection
- 6) Submit detailed final invoice to Energy Services along with building permit inspection
- 7) Energy Services staff verifies work completed to specifications and submits for City payment
- 8) Customer receives rebate check in the mail (approximately 30 days)
